Pupil premium 2016-2017

Income

The expected income for pupil premium children is £27,280 plus a terms allocation from the new financial year.

Planned use of additional money

We plan to use it to support Literacy interventions, SEN support, EAL support, Maths interventions and fine and gross motor skills interventions. We will also support the social and emotional needs of children and work with families who are having difficulties in their lives. Where needed we will support pupil premium families to fund school trips, clubs and breakfast club attendance. We will provide training for staff and additional time for the Senco to work with the children and families. We have also assigned a Teaching assistant to deliver interventions for most of the week, a significant number of the children taking part in these interventions will be pupil premium children.

We are introducing structured conversations for every child in school. These are longer parent meetings in the Autumn and Spring term, between 30 and 45 minutes. In the summer term there will be a final shorter conversation. We will use pupil premium money to fund free time during the school day for teachers to hold these conversations.

Targets

We aim to narrow the gap between the attainment of Pupil premium children and non-pupil children. We will aim to ensure that all pupil premium children make expected progress for their age.

We will evaluate the impact of each provision half termly with measurable data.

We will continue to track closely pupil premium children and any gaps. We will have deeper discussions in pupil progress meetings around whether gaps are closing and which provision is having the most impact and why.

Through structured conversations we will work more closely with parents on children's attainment, progress, provision and aspirations.

We will encourage Pupil premium children to take part in wider school activities and consult them about what activities they would like to do.

We will put in additional and new measures to improve the attendance of all children including pupil premium children.
